District Council Report

A District Council meeting was held on Tuesday 14 June 2020 at Greetham Valley Golf Club on a face to face basis only owing to technical issues which had been advised in advance. On behalf of Leicester, Richard Power, Moira Bartlett and I attended and all voted in favour of the various motions.

The meeting included a live link with a Rotary District in the Ukraine which with financial support from Rotary clubs and the Rotary Foundation is building housing units at about £10,000 each for those made homeless in a village temporarily occupied by Russian forces.

The Rotary Foundation has received over \$15 million in donations for Ukraine of which the majority is still available for Club matching grant projects.

It was agreed that the next District 1070 Conference will be a one-day event on Saturday 6 May 2023 at Drayton Manor, Staffordshire (about an hour's drive from Leicester) at a registration fee including tea, coffee and lunch of only £34.00. For those who wish to make it a "weekend" Friday entertainment will be live jazz music at the conference hotel and dinner on the Saturday available at £35. Conferences pre Covid were held in September which is believed to be better. In order to move back to this it is proposed that a combined conference covering the Rotary years 2023/24 and 2024/25 is held at on 28-30 June 2024. This would also include celebration of our District's Centenary and the District Governor handover. The following conference would then be held in September 2025.
