

RICHARD POWER'S HEBRIDEAN WALK



In September my partner Trish and I set off from Vatersay at the lower end of the Outer Hebrides to walk the Hebridean Way. This route was launched in 2017 following the success of the Cycling Hebridean Way. In theory it is 250k long but we managed to stretch it to 270k by walking to accommodation at the start and finish of some legs as well as occasionally inadvertantly going off route. The Way crosses 10 islands mostly by causeway but also two inter-island ferries.

The weather was truly Hebridean with much low cloud and fine rain but with the odd sunny day. The terrain varies from low-lying peat bog to

typical highland scenery. Although most of the walking was on either old tracks or peat turf paths there was also a fair amount of tarmac; that being the only route through the many lochans, particularly on the Uists.

The wildlife in the Outer Hebrides is varied with a fantastic variety of birdlife and we were lucky to have two Golden Eagle sitings as well as the rare Corncrake. A sea otter also wandered across our path walking up the beach of South Uist.

Unsurprisingly despite the many calories burnt, weight remained unchanged as a result of the excellent food and drink. To be recommended, Hebridean scallops and Downpour Gin from the North Uist distillery.

The feet certainly took a hammering saying goodbye to a few toenails as well as having one or two impressive blisters but it was all worthwhile as it felt an achievement and we managed to raise just over £2,000 for the Epidermal Dysplasia Society and the Leicester Gondar Orthopaedic Partnership, and many thanks to those who sponsored us.
