ROTARY PEACE POLE



The International Rotary Presidents theme for 2023-2024 was 'Create Hope in the World'. With this in mind, the Rotary Club of Leicester Impact Group decided they would like to erect a Rotary Peace Pole in the Communities Food and Wellbeing Garden situated at the Hilltop Allotments in Evington, Leicester. Each pole is a hand-crafted monument that displays the message "May Peace Prevail On Earth" on each of its four or six sides, usually in different languages. There are tens of thousands of Peace Poles in 180 countries, all over the world, dedicated as monuments to Peace.

A brief was given to 4 young Impacters by Rotarian Diana Esho to raise enough money to buy and erect a Peace Pole. The brief/challenge was accepted and the young people aged between 11 - 14 quickly grouped to decide on how to raise the funds. Over 7 months they picked fruit and made jam, they made soaps and candles which were sold to friends, family and at Rotary meetings. A four-sided pole was chosen with four languages based on the 3 main languages spoken within Leicester. Japanese was the fourth to signify where the concept of the Peace Pole started back in 1955 in response to the bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

On Wednesday 17th of July, the Peace Pole was erected with each language facing north, south, east and west. Purple lavender was planted and purple crocus bulbs are in line to be planted in 2025 to remember the End Polio Now campaign. District Governor Chris Knight and his wife Jane came to unveil the pole together with members of the Rotary Club and friends. The process of registering the pole on the global register has begun https://
